INTRODUCTION

The **European Association for International Education (EAIE)** is among the foremost global forums dedicated to advancing the international dimension of higher education. Since its establishment in 1989, EAIE has been a pivotal meeting place for universities, institutions, governmental bodies, and higher education professionals worldwide. Its annual Conference & Exhibition is widely recognized for shaping policy, best practices, and collaboration in internationalization.

The 35th EAIE Conference & Exhibition will be held in Gothenburg, Sweden, from 9 to 12 September 2025 under the theme "GO-create." This theme underscores the conference's emphasis on collaboration, cooperation, and co-creation against the broader imperatives of sustainability, inclusion, and innovation. Participants are encouraged not simply to observe trends but to actively shape them through joint, creative endeavours and transformative thinking.

For the first time since its inception, **Egypt** is participating as **the first country outside the European University Association** in a special workshop on the internationalization of higher education and scientific research. This participation came through an official invitation from the European Association for International Education. Dr. Ayman Ashour, Egypt's Minister of Higher Education and Scientific Research, participated in this workshop, which was part of the exhibition's activities. This reflects Egypt's advanced standing in the internationalization of education at both the regional and international levels.

Why is EAIE 2025 Especially Significant?

- **Scale and Reach:** EAIE 2025 will bring together over 7,000 participants from more than 100 countries, with 250+ sessions and over 1,000 organisations represented at the exhibition.
- **Context of the Host City:** Gothenburg has a long tradition of trade, migration, and innovation. It is internationally recognised for its sustainable urban planning, inclusivity, and academic vitality. It boasts two universities and a student population of around 65,000. Its identity aligns closely with sustainability, inclusion, and co-creation themes.
- **The GO-create Theme:** More than a catchy slogan, “GO-create” is a call to action. It invites attendees to rethink how higher education can evolve by involving diverse stakeholders—students, staff, and communities—in designing new learning models, partnerships, research, mobility, and social impact. It reflects a shift from competition toward shared responsibility and co-designed solutions.
- **Strategic Issues & Innovation:** Key sessions address pressing global challenges, digital transitions in mobility and education programmes (notably Erasmus+), policy innovation, sustainable development goals, and equity and inclusion. These topics are especially relevant for universities seeking to enhance resilience, outreach, and global engagement.

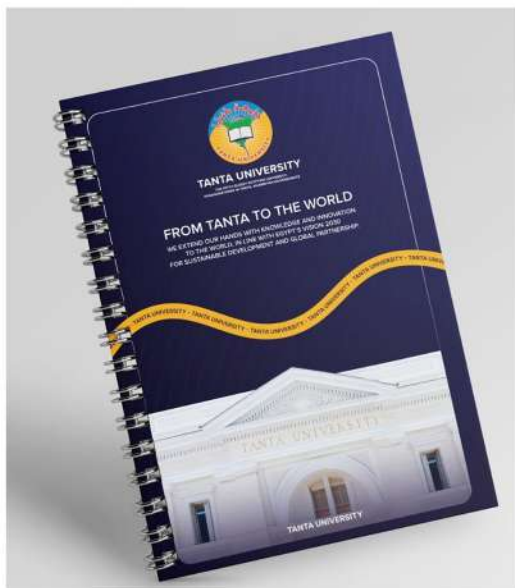


Alignment with Tanta University's Strategic Goals

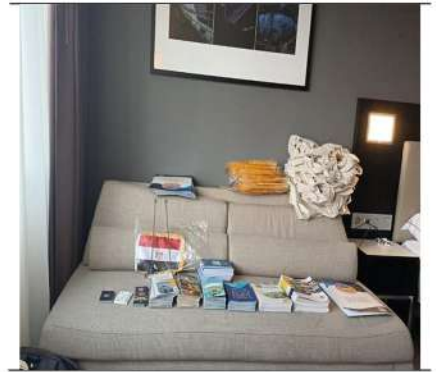
Preparation Procedures Aligned with Ministry Recommendations

1. Promotional Efforts and Materials

- Tanta University developed comprehensive promotional packages in both digital and print formats.
- Materials included an updated institutional profile, details on postgraduate programs, and highlights of ongoing international research collaborations.

2. Cultural and Extracurricular Promotion

In cooperation with the national “Study in Egypt” initiative, Tanta University prepared materials highlighting its cultural, artistic, and sports activities. This showcased the holistic student experience in Egypt, further strengthening the attractiveness of studying at Egyptian institutions.



3. Effective Use of EAIE Digital Tools

- Delegates were trained to manage meetings using the official EAIE electronic application.
- A follow-up system was established to ensure all scheduled meetings with international partners were attended and documented.

4. Expanding International Partnerships

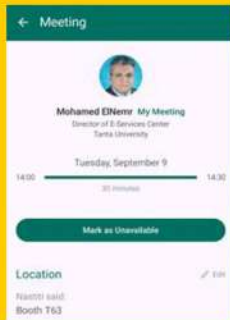
- **Before the conference, Tanta University mapped potential European institutions** for dual/joint degree collaboration.
- Meetings were scheduled with partner universities to discuss frameworks for academic mobility, faculty exchange, and joint research projects.

5. Establishing Double-Degree Programs

- The university presented proposals for academic partnerships, including double-degree programs in strategic disciplines, particularly medicine, engineering, and applied sciences.
- Special emphasis was placed on aligning these programs with global accreditation standards to enhance competitiveness.

6. Hosting and Receiving International Students

- The university's delegation actively welcomed international students and visitors at the Egyptian universities' booth.
- Tanta University highlighted its academic strengths and student services under the national "Study in Egypt" campaign, ensuring a strong promotional presence for Egypt as a regional education hub.

OVERVIEW- Communication Plan with Universities Participating in the International Higher Education Exhibition – Sweden 2025

As part of Tanta University's strategy to strengthen its international presence and enhance its position in global rankings, the University participated in the International Higher Education Exhibition organized by the European Association for International Education (EAIE), held in Gothenburg, Sweden, from 9 to 12 September 2025. A comprehensive pre-prepared plan was developed to communicate with participating universities, focusing on comparative analysis, identifying areas of cooperation, field execution, and impact-based follow-up..

I.Universities ANALYSIS

- ✳ •Develop a database of participating universities, classified by continent, country, booth number, and international rankings (QS – Shanghai – THE – US News).
- Conduct a benchmarking study comparing Tanta University's position with these institutions.

- ✳ Define communication priorities in two stages:
 - Stage One:** Engage with universities of comparable rankings to create a competitive advantage and establish balanced partnerships.
 - Stage Two:** Engage with globally top-ranked universities to build long-term strategic partnerships.

II. Study of Areas of Cooperation

Analyze each foreign university's competitive advantages (leading disciplines, research centers, and fields of excellence).



- Prepare a comparative file highlighting Tanta University's rankings and research output over the past five years, aligned with the areas of strength of foreign universities.
- Compile a detailed report using Scopus-SciVal databases, outlining cooperation with each university, focusing on joint publications, the number of researchers registered on the platform, ranking comparisons, research output, citation rates, and common fields during the past five years. This includes an analysis of research collaboration between foreign universities and Egypt as a whole (based on files provided by the Ministry).
- Review the official websites of participating universities to identify strengths, mutual interests, and potential areas of cooperation, such as:

Joint academic programs

o (Bachelor's, Master's, PhD).

Joint funded research projects

(Erasmus+, Horizon Europe)

Exchange of faculty members and students

Cooperation in establishing laboratories and joint research centers

- Prepare professional promotional materials about Tanta University, including Fact Sheets in English, short presentations, and other marketing materials.



CREDIBILITY

Manage bilateral meetings using a negotiation approach based on data and evidence (rankings, research, previous partnerships) to ensure credibility.



IV. Measuring Impact

- Maintain an official record detailing each meeting (university – cooperation areas

- level of progress).
 - Send follow-up thank-you letters and draft Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) with universities that show readiness to collaborate.

- Establish joint contact teams to monitor implementation and translate outcomes into concrete agreements.

- Measure impact through clear indicators: number of agreements, joint publications, dual-degree programs, and international citation rates.

- Gather the maximum number of institutional contacts to improve the University's academic reputation indicator within the QS ranking system.

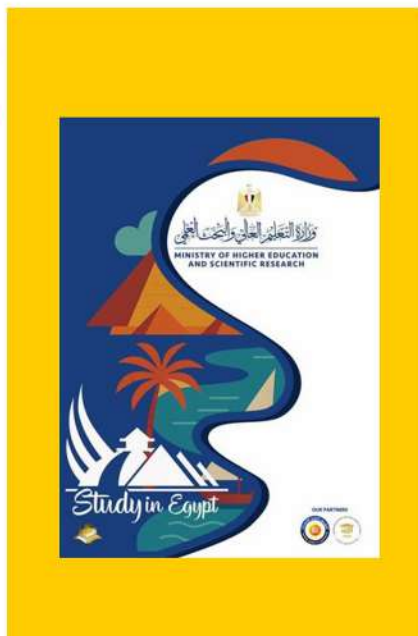

FUTURE PLAN

1. **Formalize Partnerships:** Follow up on established leads to finalize Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) and create joint committees, particularly focusing on student and faculty mobility and collaborative research programs.
